Rural grants

Grants to assist rural students commencing a course in commerce, law or management are available at Deakin's Warrnambool campus in 2008. The scheme has been allocated \$100,000.

"This scheme is one of Deakin's responses to the needs of highly qualified rural students who wish to pursue tertiary education but who would find the cost of studying at university prohibitive," the dean of the Faculty of Business and Law, Professor Philip Clarke said.

Cancer vaccine available

A free vaccine to prevent cervical cancer in women is now available at Deakin University Health Service.

The Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccine Gardasil can prevent cervical, vulvar, and vaginal cancer, pre-cancerous or dysplastic lesions, genital warts, and infection caused by HPV. High risk HPV types 16 and 18 account for more than 70 per cent of cervical cancers in Australia.

Gardasil has been extensively trialed in

North America, Europe and Australia for five years in over 20,000 people aged nine to 26 years of age. In addition since 2006 around 2 million doses of the vaccine have been given after becoming licensed in the USA.

The vaccine is given as three injections over six months into the upper arm.

To be eligible for the treatment women must be aged 18 to 26 years and hold a valid Medicare card.
