

Monash beats Melbourne

The University of Sydney claimed the Overall Winner Trophy at the 2007 Australian University Games held on the Gold Coast in September.

Coming in second was Monash University, ahead of The University of Melbourne in third.

The Victorian rivalry was highlighted in the final AFL footy match for the E.J Hartung Intersvarsity Cup won by Monash (team shot pictured top left and in action against University of Adelaide, right) over Melbourne.

In the women's AFL final, Monash beat Deakin 26-18.

University of Western Australia took home the gold when they defeated Macquarie University yesterday 7-2. Melbourne University defeated Monash to take the bronze medal in baseball (Melbourne Pitcher Jacob Breen pictured left).

Monash defeated Deakin to take the men's basketball gold.

Melbourne University won the men's hockey silver. They also took overall team silver in the swimming.
