Victorian Rhodes Scholar



University of Melbourne commerce and science student John Feddersen is the Victorian Rhodes Scholar recipient.

Feddersen, was one of four University of Melbourne finalists to reach the final round. Of the others, Medicine, Surgery and Arts graduate Kate Robson was selected as an Australia at Large scholar, and will go to Canberra with the chance of securing one of three remaining Rhodes Scholarship places.

Feddersen, who has completed a Bachelor of Commerce (Economics), a Bachelor of Science (Mathematics and Statistics) and a Diploma in Modern Language (German) has also somehow found time to pursue a very

successful hockey career. He has earned four University Blue Awards in Hockey, making the Australian Universities team, Victorian Vikings Squad and Australian Under 19 team along the way. The keen life saver from the Lorne Life Saving Club also captained the University team to victory at the Australian University Games in 2006.

Rhodes Scholarships are offered by the Rhodes Trust in Australia every year, with successful recipients receiving a full time postgraduate course position of their choice at Oxford University. The scholarship also provides a monthly stipend to the successful applicants, with all University and residential College fees paid for by the Rhodes Trust.
