University of South Australia Water Markets Research APAI Scholarships

Two PhD scholarships are available from late 2009 to 2013 in the Centre for Regulation and Market Analysis (CRMA) at the University of South Australia (UniSA) for a study of water markets. A range of water analyses, case studies and water modelling will be conducted by a multidisciplinary team working on an Australian Research Council (ARC) Linkage Project.

Each candidate will receive a tax-free scholarship of \$26,669 per annum plus a budget of \$6,000 per annum for costs associated with the research. Top-up scholarships may also be available. Candidates interested in studying the community and social impacts of water markets in Australia are encouraged to apply. In particular, we are looking for graduates with strong qualifications in environmental or natural resource economics, econometrics and/or sociology, with at least an Honours degree.
